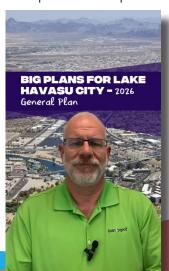






Social Engagement

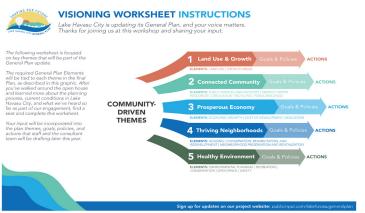

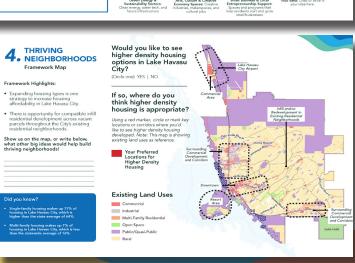
Two in-person community workshops were held at the Mohave County Library on separate days and times with **63 participants**. The virtual workshop mirrored the in-person events with **85 participants**.

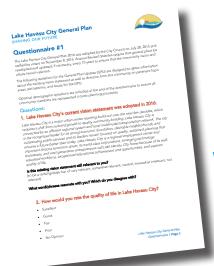

Questionnaire #1



Questionnaire #1 was launched to gain feedback and perspectives from the community on strengths, opportunities, aspirations, and results (SOAR) associated with City growth and development. The Theme Aspirational Statements were derived from Q1 and refined with the project team and in steering committee meetings.

Promotion happened through social media as well as at community drop-in events. **831 responses** were received from the questionnaire.

What we learned:

1. Community Identity & Vision

Theme: Strong desire to preserve small-town character.

2. Housing & Affordability

Theme: Affordable housing is important.

3. Economic Development & Jobs

Theme: Would like more well-paying jobs; concerns about over-reliance on tourism and service industries.

4. Infrastructure & Transportation

Theme: Plan to prevent more traffic congestion, and public transit or bike infrastructure.

5. Healthcare & Public Services

Theme: Access to healthcare, especially specialists and emergency services is a concern.

6. Youth & Family Needs

Theme: Would like more sports fields, indoor recreation, and youth programs.

7. Environmental & Aesthetic Concerns Theme: Shore protection is important.



Listening Sessions



Top Themes:

Themes from the listening session revealed strong community sentiment around preserving the city's small-town identity, addressing housing affordability, and improving infrastructure. Residents voiced concerns about over development, the rising cost of living, and limited access to healthcare and youth services. Strong resonant feedback seeking greater diversity of job opportunities and the city's perceived prioritization of tourism and retirees over working families and young professionals.

During the Visioning phase, **20 listening sessions** were conducted to discuss issues most important to the community; opportunities and ideas to integrate into the GPU; and desired plan outcomes. A comprehensive list of stakeholders, local officials, business people, regional leaders and involved citizens were invited to these sessions held over several weeks both in person and virtually.

We envision a strong and growing economy that supports local businesses, draws a broad range of industries, and prioritizes education and workforce development—creating opportunities for residents to find meaningful work, manage the cost of living, and build successful futures.

Thriving Neighborhoods

We envision thriving neighborhoods with a variety of housing choices, continued investment in older areas, and a strong sense of local identity—creating opportunities for residents to live, work, and grow in a unique desert community.

Healthy Environment

We will safeguard our natural surroundings through thoughtful planning, preservation of open land and proactive risk management—maintaining the beauty, safety, and recreational benefits of our desert and lake landscapes for future generations.
