**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF LAKE HAVASU CITY,
MOHAVE COUNTY, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF AN
APPLICATION FOR A GRANT TO THE U. S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE
OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE, FOR A UV/IR
CAMERA AND RELATED EQUIPMENT TO ENHANCE THE RESEARCH AND
DEVELOPMENT IN FORENSIC SCIENCE FOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE PURPOSES,
AND AUTHORIZING ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND
COMPLETE THE ACTIVITIES OUTLINED IN THE APPLICATION**

RECITALS: The Lake Havasu City Police Department desires to purchase a UV/IR camera and related equipment, and The National Institute of Justice (“NIJ”) of the U.S. Department of Justice (“DOJ”) provides funding through federal grants to assist local communities. This funding supports furthering research and development projects to direct the findings of basic scientific research; research, and development in broader scientific fields applicable to forensic science; and ongoing forensic science research toward the development of highly-discriminating, accurate, reliable, cost-effective, and rapid methods for the identification, analysis, and interpretation of physical evidence for criminal justice purposes.

IT IS RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of Lake Havasu City, Arizona, authorize the submission of an application for funding for a UV/IR camera and related equipment to enhance research and development in forensic science for criminal justice purposes; and authorize the City Manager to execute the application and grant agreement and any additional documents necessary for the receipt and use of the grant funds subject to the approval as to form by the City Attorney; and authorize and direct the City Manager and City Staff to take all actions necessary to implement and complete the activities outlined in the application.
